In preparation for a BCLAD, students are required to declare a concentration either in Chicano/Latino or Asian American studies. Courses in the Chicano/Latino concentration must include EWS 202, EWS 402 (Chicano/Latino) and SPN 401 or EWS 301, which focuses on a target Asian group, for the Asian concentration. A high intermediate level of Spanish is required for the BCLAD (Spanish) and of a target Asian language (Korean, Cantonese, Cambodian or Vietnamese) for the BCLAD (Asian).
