DEPARTMENT OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

POSITION: Head Coach, Women's Soccer. Academic Year, 10-month appointment in the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics. Subsequent appointments are based on merit and program needs.

STARTING DATE: April 15, 2006 (negotiable).

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution required. Demonstrated successful coaching experience at the collegiate or club levels. Commitment to the academic and athletic success of the student-athlete. Must have a strong commitment to the welfare of student-athletes and a reputation of integrity, both professionally and in compliance matters. Proficiency in oral and written communication and administrative abilities necessary. Demonstrated ability and/or interest in working in a multi-ethnic, multicultural environment.

DUTIES: Serve as Head Coach, Cal Poly Pomona Women's Soccer, NCAA Division II program. The University is a member of the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA). Responsibilities include, budgeting, coordinating practices and games, recruiting, scouting, ordering equipment, scheduling, monitoring the strength and conditioning program, academic oversight and fund raising. The Head Coach is responsible for following and enforcing institutional, conference, and NCAA policies and regulations relevant to Cal Poly Pomona. Reports to the Director of Athletics.

THE UNIVERSITY: Nestled among 1,438 acres of rolling green hills, California State Polytechnic University, Pomona is the second largest campus in the California State University system. At the hub of Southern California activities, the university is just an hour's drive from ski areas to the north, deserts to the east, beaches to the south and downtown Los Angeles to the west. Among both public and private universities, Cal Poly Pomona ranked 31st in Best Universities-Masters (by region), placing in the top tier of Western universities with undergraduate and masters programs. The University is committed to academic excellence.

SALARY RANGE: Initial salary commensurate with qualifications and experience will be within the range of approximately \$45,000 - \$65,000.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION: letter of application, resume, email address, three letters of recommendation; and transcript awarding highest degree from an accredited institution. Employment contingent upon proof of eligibility to work in the United States and completion of the University's Application for Academic Employment form.
