Paul Caligiuri

One of the most successful and recognizable soccer players in the United States, Hall of Famer Paul Caligiuri begins his fourth year as the head coach of Cal Poly Pomona's men's and women's soccer teams.

Caligiuri, a former member of the Los Angeles Galaxy and veteran of the U.S. National Team, was elected to the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in 2004 and was officially inducted last October along with Michelle Akers and Eric Wynalda. Undoubtedly one of the best soccer players to ever play for the United States, the Walnut native played professionally and internationally for 18 years.

He joined Cal Poly Pomona shortly after he finished his playing career with the Galaxy. In his first three years at Cal Poly Pomona, Caligiuri has compiled a 22-29-4 record with the men's team and a 30-21-7 record with the women's team.

Last season, the Bronco men finished with a 7-11-1 overall record and were in the race for a spot in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship tournament until the final week of the season. The women's team finished strongly and qualified for the CCAA championship tournament for an unprecedented seventh straight season.

In 2003, the Bronco men finished with a 7-9-2 overall record and were in the race for a spot in the CCAA championship tournament until the final day of the season. The women's team finished with a 10-8-1 record and won its last three regular-season matches to qualify for the CCAA Championship Tournament for the sixth consecutive season.

In his first year at Cal Poly Pomona, Caligiuri guided the men's team to an 8-9-1 overall record, which was significantly better than the 3-15-1 record the Broncos struggled to the previous season. The Broncos finished second in the CCAA South Division and posted an impressive victory over NCAA Division II champion Sonoma State. Caligiuri led the women's team to an 11-6-2 overall record despite key injuries to several of the team's top players. The Broncos qualified for the CCAA Championship Tournament for the fifth straight year and wound up ranked 25th in the nation, marking the fourth straight time Cal Poly Pomona finished a season ranked in the national Top 25.

From 1984-97, Caligiuri was a member of the United States national team and had 110 game appearances, including participation in two World Cups in 1990 and 1994 and the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, Korea. One of the most memorable moments of his playing career came in 1990 when he scored the game-winning goal – known as the "Goal Heard Round The World" – against Trinidad & Tobago that qualified the

U.S. for its first World Cup in 40 years.

Well-respected internationally, Caligiuri played professionally in West Germany and became the first American player to make a Division I professional team in Europe. He completed his career abroad with St. Pauli, German Bundesliga in 1995.

In 1996, Caligiuri played for the Columbus Crew of the newly-founded Major Soccer League. After one year with the Crew, Caligiuri was assigned to the Galaxy, where he helped the team become one of the top defensive units in the league. Los Angeles reached the MSL championship game two times while Caligiuri was with the team.

While he was finishing his playing career, Caligiuri was also working toward a career in coaching. He acquired his "A" License from the U.S. Soccer Federation and, in the past few years, Caligiuri has been involved with consulting in coaching, playing and organizing camps and clinics throughout the United States.

Caligiuri graduated from nearby Walnut High School in 1982 and then played at UCLA from 1982-86. A two-time All-American at UCLA, Caligiuri captained the Bruins to the NCAA Division I championship in 1985, earning the Most Valuable Player award in the title game. As a senior, he was named the 1986 U.S. Male Soccer Athlete of the Year. In 1996, he was inducted into the UCLA Hall of Fame.

He is also an accomplished broadcaster, working as an expert commentator on MLS and other international league games with Fox Sports World. He also worked as a commentator on ESPN 2's "World Cup 2Night" during the 2002 World Cup. He is also an active ambassador for the sport of soccer and toured Air Force bases in London, Germany, Turkey and Norway as part of the Extreme Summer 2002 Goodwill Military Tour. He is currently on the board of the Board of Directors for the U.S. Soccer Federation.

Caligiuri was also on the coaching staff for the adidas Elite Soccer Program 2005 and is one of eight coaches on this national Olympic Development Program (ODP) staff. The program is sanctioned by the U.S. Olympic Committee. He also hosted a Kids' Clinic at the National Soccer Hall of Fame in Oneonta, N.Y. in May and was the keynote clinician for the 2005 New York State High School Soccer Coaches Clinic.

Caligiuri graduated with a bachelor's degree in sociology from UCLA in the College of Letters and Science. He has two daughters: Ashley, 13, and Kayley, 9.

Janet Cassidy

Second Year



A former player with an impressive and diverse background, Cassidy returns for her second season on the Cal Poly Pomona coaching staff. She will be the assistant coach for the women's team.

In her first year with the program, Cassidy helped the Bronco women to a 9-7-4 overall record and an unprecedented seventh straight appearance in the California Collegiate Athletic Association Championship Tournament.

Cassidy was an assistant coach at Riverside Community College in 2002-03 and has also been the head coach at Vista del Lago High School in Moreno Valley since 2002. She was the Vista del Lago HS "Coach of the Year" for 2003-04 and she also earned a Coke Outstanding Coach award in 2003-04. Vista del Lago was the DeAnza League champions in 2003-04.

Cassidy was also a volunteer helping to train the Special Olympics Soccer team in November of 2003 and she serves as the director of coaching and player development for the AL Alliance Soccer Club for Under-14 girls, Under-13 girls and Under-11 girls.

She made the USA Select Team when she was 13 years old and then became a star player at John W. North HS in Riverside. She played varsity soccer for four years and served as team captain for three years. She was the team's leading scorer twice and the team Most Valuable Player in 1991.

Cassidy played for two seasons at Riverside City College, where she was the team captain for two years and was the team's Best Offensive Player in 1997 and 1998. She also won the Coach's Award both seasons and graduated with an associates degree in fine arts in 1998.

Cassidy then transferred to San Diego State, where she graduated in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in fine arts with an emphasis in graphic design. She was a graphic intern for the San Diego Union Tribune in 2001 and she was also an art instructor for Art Tours, Inc. in La Jolla.

Assistant Coach

Emanuel Martins

Second Year



A talented coach with an extensive background, Martins returns for his second season on the Cal Poly Pomona staff. He will serve once again as the men's assistant coach. Martins was the head coach at Sylmar High School for eight years and an assistant coach at Los Angeles Mission College for three years.

Martins coached Sylmar to an overall record of 101-54-22. The team recorded a 1-13 record in the first season, but has since posted two 20-win seasons and three league championships. He has also influenced the program into becoming the school's top academic team for two consecutive seasons.

At Los Angeles Mission College, he served since the program was reinstated in 2001. In three seasons, his responsibilities encompassed fitness, recruiting, academic progress and offense. In its first two seasons of play, L.A. Mission won a conference championship, sent eight players to NCAA Division I and II programs and compiled an overall record of 21-8-7 with a state ranking of No. 2 and a national ranking of No. 3.

Martins was born in Portugal and moved to San Fernando in 1993 where he played soccer at Sylmar High School and Mission College. He is currently completing a degree in Kinesiology at Cal Poly Pomona and also plans to pursue a

Masters of Science in Kinesiology.

Martins was also a guest analyst on the KLCS Soccer Preview Show from 2000-2003 and appeared in an American Airlines National Soccer Commercial in 2000. He is fluent in Portuguese, Spanish, English and Creolo.

Martins lives in Sylmar with his wife, Lorena, and their three-year-old son, Marley and eight-month-old daughter, Emma.

A graduate of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo who has played semi-pro soccer in his career, Peterson returns for his second year with the Cal Poly Pomona soccer programs. He serves as the goalkeepers' coach on the men's and women's teams.

He graduated from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo with a bachelor's degree in philosophy and also played soccer for the Mustangs in 1995. He also played at Santa Barbara City College in 1994.

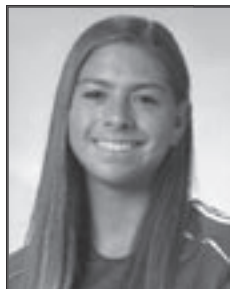
After three impressive seasons with the Broncos, Black returns for her fourth season with the program. Is a tactically sound player who is a good passer and has a strong shot.
