PRESIDENT'S COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIPS 2010-2011 \$2,500 Per Award

The President's Council Scholarship is the most prestigious scholarship given by the University to continuing Cal Poly Pomona students. It is a merit scholarship, established in 1983 to give special recognition for academic and extracurricular excellence at Cal Poly Pomona. **Undergraduate students, graduate students in the College of Engineering and College of Letters, Arts, & Social Science (CLASS) and students in the Teacher Education Credential Program are eligible to apply. Two at-large scholarships are also available to undergraduate and graduate students from all colleges.** Members of the President's Council fund the scholarship program through private endowment contributions.

The scholarships are awarded each year to undergraduate students from each of the University's eight academic colleges, to graduate students from the College of Engineering and CLASS and to students enrolled in the Teacher Credential Program. The scholarship award is presented to the selected scholars by the University President at a special recognition ceremony at the beginning of Fall Quarter.

PRESIDENT'S COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIPS
ELIGIBILITY AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Eligibility Requirements:

- ◆ Junior or Senior standing in any major for the 2010-2011 award year (minimum of 80 units completed by the Fall 2009 quarter) with an overall GPA of 3.5 or better at the end of the Fall 2009 quarter.
- ◆ Graduate students in the College of Engineering and College of Letters, Arts & Social Sciences (CLASS) with an overall GPA of 3.7 or better at the end of the Fall 2009 quarter.
- ◆ Significant contributions to university and community activities.
- ◆ Merit only – financial need is not considered.
- ◆ Two at-large scholarships are also available to undergraduate and graduate students from all colleges.
- ◆ **Undergraduate students must attend full-time, all three quarters (fall, winter and spring) of 2010-2011.**
- ◆ Graduate and teacher credential students must attend all three quarters (fall, winter and spring) of 2010-2011, but are exempt from attending full-time.
- ◆ Students graduating mid-year do not qualify.
- ◆ Prior winners are **not** eligible to reapply.
- ◆ International students may apply.

Application Requirements:

- ◆ Submit the President's Council Scholarship packet to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships.
- ◆ Submit two faculty recommendations. At least one recommendation should be from your major department. (Graduate students may obtain faculty recommendations from professors from their undergraduate studies.)

Deadline to Apply:

- ◆ **MARCH 2, 2010** – All materials must be received in the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships, CLA Bldg. #98, 3rd floor by 5:00 p.m.

What's Next:

After you have submitted your completed scholarship packet to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships:

- ◆ A selection committee comprised of members of the President's Council and university administrators is appointed by the President.
- ◆ Finalists are interviewed by the selection committee during Spring Quarter and recommendations are made to the President for final review and selection of scholarship awards.
- ◆ Award notifications are sent out in early summer.
- ◆ One-third of the monetary award is applied to the student's school account each quarter (fall, winter and spring).
