ENDOWMENTS & GIFTS

LIBRARY ENDOWMENT HONORS THE LATE PROFESSOR AND NOTED WORLD WAR II CORRESPONDENT CECIL BROWN

Martha Brown has been a major supporter of the University Library since 1990. She has contributed toward the growth and enrichment of the Library's collections through annual gifts of funds in honor of her late husband, Cecil Brown, a veteran war correspondent, as well as a Cal Poly Pomona professor from 1970 to 1980. In September 1988 she continued her support with a \$20,000 gift to the Library, creating The Cecil Brown Memorial Endowment . The endowment's principal will remain intact, while net returns will be used to enhance the Library's social science collections. As a bonus, Mrs. Brown doubled the value of her gift by being the first donor to take advantage of The W. K. Kellogg Foundation Challenge Grant , which matches every endowment gift from September 1998 through September 2004, up to \$6 million. The original gift of \$20,000 was matched by the Michigan-based foundation, adding \$15,000 to Brown's endowment as well as another \$5,000 to a general University endowment fund.

Cecil Brown passed away in 1987 after a distinguished career as a journalist and professor. As a World War II correspondent he worked closely with other distinguished journalists such as Edward R. Murrow, Eric Sevareid and William Shirer. During his lifetime, he was awarded some of broadcasting's highest honors including the George Foster Peabody Award for journalistic excellence and the Overseas Press Club Best Reporter Award. In addition he was named the Alfred I. DuPont & Associated Press Commentator for KCET. Brown excelled in teaching as well as scholarship and received Cal Poly Pomona's Outstanding Professor award in 1980. He was a respected professor who taught American Civilization in the social sciences department.

DONALD H. PFLUEGER MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT

Many years ago history professor Dr. Donald H. Pflueger began researching and compiling a manuscript on the history of Cal Poly Pomona. Originally his plan was to publish a book for the campus' 50th Anniversary celebration in 1988. Unfortunately, the work was delayed and Dr. Pflueger passed away before the book was published. The Library began working with Dr. Pflueger's family in 1988 to complete the final editing and publication of the manuscript.

California State Polytechnic University, Pomona: A Legacy and a Mission:1938-1989 has now been published by the Arthur H. Clark Company. This work is the first dedicated entirely to the history of Cal Poly Pomona. Circulating copies are available for checkout. A personal copy of the book may be obtained by making a \$100 donation to the Library. The Pflueger estate has generously permitted the Library to recover proceeds generated by this book. The Library intends to use these donations to establish the Donald H. Pflueger Memorial Endowment , for the purpose of purchasing materials in all formats in support of our history curriculum. The Library is preparing for its 2nd Annual Student Appreciation Reception in June, which honors all student assistants but especially graduating seniors. Students also learn skills on the job that will serve them well in the future: organization, time management, diplomacy, dependability and, of course, increased knowledge of library resources and services.
