### Where do I find books about nonprofits I can take home?

Library Catalog: **Subject <S>** option from the menu; enter Library of Congress Subject Headings:

**corporations, nonprofit.**  
**charitable uses, trusts, and foundations**  
**unincorporated societies**

You can also use the **Keyword <K>** option and enter related terms. For example: **nonprofit management.**

There is no single range of numbers for the books about nonprofit corporations; two of the most common are **HD62.6** (on the Sixth Floor) and **HG4027.65** (on the Fifth Floor).

### Which indexes do I use to find articles about grantsmanship or nonprofits?

(Consult *Business Subjects Databases* guide)

#### *ABI/Inform Global* **Databases**

You can search directly for "Company/Org"; select **Advanced Search** tab.

#### *Factiva* **Databases**

Access to 9,000 business periodicals.

*Hoovers Company Reports* **Databases** Files for data on 40,000 Companies. The listings include not-for-profit enterprises. Information includes executives.

#### *Lexis/Nexis Universe* **Databases**

Full text news; there is a category for "Company News."

*Sociological Abstracts* **Databases**

Includes articles about grants, philanthropy, the nonprofit sector and the like.

*Business Full Text* (Wilson Web) **Databases** Some 350 essential business periodicals are included in this index; abstracts, and some full text.

**Where can I find Internet sites about foundations and grants?**

*Websites by Subject* Library Home page: see the "Grants and Foundations" page <http://www.csupomona.edu/~library/websites/grants.html> for a comprehensive listing of sites. These include Federal and California government sites.

**See especially:** *GuideStar* <http://www.guidestar.org/index.jsp> Register for free access to information on 1.7 million nonprofits. There is a search window for the organizations' mission, programs, and finances.
