## CAL POLY POMONA UNIVERSITY POLICE DEPARTMENT

The University Police Department at Cal Poly Pomona is responsible for law enforcement, security, and emergency planning on campus. Located on the campus in Building 91 on Red Gum and University Drive, the department is staffed by sworn law enforcement officers, managers/administrators, auxiliary and support personnel, Community Service Officers (CSO's), and community volunteers. The department operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week year-round.

State University police officers are vested with the same powers and responsibilities as police officers throughout the State of California. Their statewide authority is granted through legislative action defined in the California Education and Penal Codes. Their jurisdiction covers all property owned and operated by the University, including adjacent public streets and property. University police officers meet the California Peace Officer's Standards and Training Commission requirements, which are mandated for all California law enforcement officers, and have full arrest authority. All University police officers are trained in the use of weapons and carry them on campus. It is a felony for other individuals to carry or store weapons on campus. The University Police Department is responsible for reporting and investigating all crimes occurring on campus.

Responding to over 10,000 calls for service annually, the University Police Department is here to help, whether providing an escort during hours of darkness, a battery jump, or by answering a 9-1-1 call for assistance. The department also offers a wide range of programs and services to ensure the safety and security of the campus, including escorts, alarm system management, security surveys, crime prevention presentations, Patrol Ride-Alongs, and self-defense workshops.

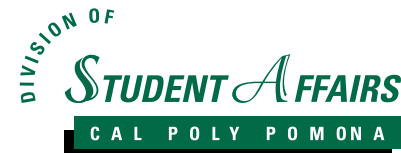

## SAFETY ON CAMPUS

Cal Poly Pomona places a high priority on the safety of the campus community. Most criminal activity on campus involves crimes against property. Limited numbers of crimes against persons are reported annually. When circumstances warrant, Crime Alert Bulletins are distributed campus wide to warn the university community of imminent danger. The Poly Post, the campus newspaper, and other communications provide timely information to the campus community regarding recent crimes, crime prevention, and policies and reporting processes.

All telephones throughout campus are connected to a university 9-1-1 emergency system linked directly to the University Police Department. A 24-hour, 7 days a week Communications Center within the department provides telephone and two-way radio contact for emergency personnel and also serves as an after-hours contact for students, faculty, and staff. Code Blue emergency phones are located throughout the parking lot areas for emergency 9-1-1 contact and to request department services. Campus community members should be aware that a 9-1-1 call from a cellular telephone goes to the California Highway Patrol completely bypassing the Cal Poly Pomona Police Dispatch and slowing emergency response. Please program the police department main phone number (909) 869-3070 into your cellular phone to ensure the quickest response in the event of an emergency.

The department also encourages individuals to take personal responsibility for their own safety and the safety of the campus community by being aware of their surroundings, taking prevention precautions, and reporting suspicious circumstances to the police.



## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The University has a well-defined and organized disaster plan with more than three hundred trained faculty and staff members who volunteer above and beyond the jobs they are hired to do. These volunteers are prepared to assist and respond to a variety of emergency situations. Training is ongoing year-round to provide volunteers with the skills necessary (evacuation, triage, first-aid, CPR, light search and rescue, use of fire extinguishers, etc.) to support the campus community in an emergency. Building Marshals are part of the Campus Emergency Management Plan. In the event of a campus emergency, Building Marshals and Floor Captains will make personal contact with building occupants and provide them with information regarding the emergency. A list of current Building Marshals and their campus locations can be found under Emergency Operations in the campus telephone directory. The University's Disaster Plan is compliant with state and federal law and is exercised on a regular basis to ensure the University's ability to respond appropriately in an emergency situation.

## STOP VIOLENCE OFFICE

A U.S. Department of Justice Violence Against Women on Campus Grant supports the Stop Violence Office. The project's mission is to reduce the trauma of violent crimes against women through education, training, survivor advocacy and support services; to modify the campus climate and reduce the incidence of these crimes by increasing awareness, improving institutional response, reducing institutional and cultural barriers to reporting; and to challenge attitudes, behaviors and values that contribute to violence against women.

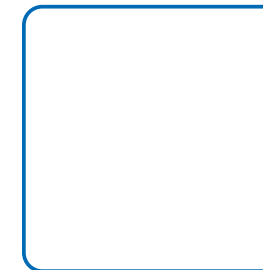
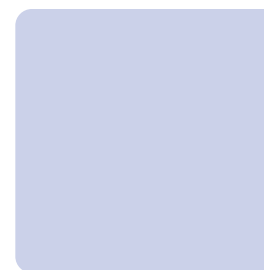
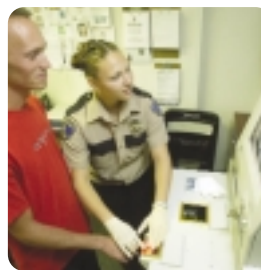

## COMMUNITY SERVICE OFFICERS (CSO'S)

Community Service Officers (CSO's) are student-assistants who work in the department's Patrol Division. Patrolling by bicycle or foot, CSO's provide additional "eyes and ears" enhancing security in and around campus buildings, parking lots and residence halls/properties (University Housing Services and the Village). CSO's also provide traffic control, applicant live scan/fingerprinting services, department technology support, dispatch assistance, weekend building unlocks, presentations/training, and special event coverage. CSO's may be identified by their tan uniforms with navy epaulets, or may be in blue polo shirts with police shoulder patches. All CSO's undergo department background checks, including DMV and criminal history clearance. Many CSO's have used this experience as an introduction into law enforcement and gone into a variety of law enforcement careers upon graduation from Cal Poly Pomona. ## CAMPUS ESCORT SERVICE

Parking and Transportation Services provide safety escorts during hours of darkness. Parking Community Service Officers (CSO's) escorts are available to walk or drive you to and/or from on-campus locations from 6:00-11:00 p.m. (Monday-Friday). Call (909) 869-3070 or extension 3070 from any campus phone to request an escort. Police officers may provide after-hours escorts as available.



## ANNUAL SECURITY REPORT (CLERY ACT)

The annual security report, Safety On Campus, "Your Right To Know", is released by October 1 of each year, and is provided as a part of the University's commitment to provide information and resources to enhance campus safety. The annual security report is in compliance with state and federal crime awareness and campus security legislation, including The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled

by Cal Poly Pomona and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus.
