NOTE: Only valid California credentials will be honored.

_____ A set of transcripts verifying degree and credential courses. (Unofficial transcripts for the interview are acceptable.)

_____ Catalogue descriptions and course outlines of any courses taken as an upper division or graduate student relating to APE.

_____ Letter(s) from school district personnel verifying satisfactory completion of a minimum of one year of teaching experience in APE. The letters should include dates, grade/age level, and handicapping conditions. In addition, teaching performance may be observed and evaluated by the Cal Poly APE faculty.

If no APE teaching experience, then student teaching or some other arrangements with the APE Coordinator will be made in order to fulfill this requirement. It is recommended that 180 hours of actual supervised APE teaching occurs to meet this requirement.

3. Formal admittance into Cal Poly as a **Graduate Student**. This is accomplished by contacting the Director of Admissions and requesting that the admission process begin. Please call (909) 869-2000 for further admission's information.

NOTE: The graduate student should consider entrance into the Cal Poly Kinesiology and Health Promotion Department's Master's Degree Program. The preceding list of courses required for the APE credential may be used as credit toward a Master's degree in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Adapted Physical Education.

4. Complete above program requirements as indicated in step #2, maintaining a **GPA of 3.0 and receiving a "B" or better in each individual course**.
5. Complete Major Approval Form and APE competency portfolio.
6. APE coordinator conducts an exit interview after review of the portfolio and signs major approval form. A recommendation will be forwarded to the Credential Analyst at CPP.
7. Complete all paperwork with the Credential Analyst.
8. Receive your credential, Adapted Physical Education Specialist.
